

**Minutes from Police Commission meeting held June 15th, 2016 submitted by Curt Jacobsen.**

**1. Call to Order**

Meeting called to order at 5:03 PM by President Bill Pryor.

**2. Roll Call**

Present were Commissioners Bill Pryor, Bill Fetzner, Curt Jacobsen, Neil Riley and Commissioner-elect Cheri Johnson. Also present was Police Chief Gary Krutke.

**3. Approve minutes for May 9 & May 18, 2016**

Motion by Jacobsen, second by Riley to approve the minutes for May 9 & May 18, 2016. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

**4. Election of officers**

Election of officers was tabled until the July 2016 meeting to allow for the official approval of new commissioner Cheri Johnson by the city council.

**5. Chief's Report**

Chief Krutke briefly reviewed his June 2016 Chief's quarterly report.

**6. Convene in Closed Session pursuant to Wis. Stat. 19.85 (1) (c) - Considering employment, promotion, compensation, or performance evaluation data of any public employee over which the governmental body has jurisdiction or exercises responsibility – Establish eligibility list**

Fetzner moved to convene in closed session, Riley seconded. Motion passed by unanimous roll call vote @ 5:10 pm.

**7. Reconvene in open session**

Riley moved to reconvene in open session, Jacobsen seconded. Motion passed by unanimous roll call vote @ 5:20 pm.

**8. Take Action on items discussed in closed session**

Chief Krutke was directed to proceed with testing of the 22 candidates for whom qualified applications were received. It is expected to be done in July, after which the commission will meet to review results.

**9. Adjournment**

Motion by Fetzner to adjourn, seconded by Riley. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote. Meeting was adjourned at 5:26 pm.

Chief's quarterly report:

June 2016

Late spring and summer are here. The start has been as expected, plenty of traffic and citations have been issued for speeding, and other traffic related offenses. Drug cases are up and I see them trending that way as certain members of society don't seem to have a problem with drug use.

The spring flood run was successful in that we did not have a lot of injuries do to traffic crashes in the City of Prescott. There were some crashes but those occurred out in the county.

We have had some issues with property owners and getting them to clean up their properties. The City of Prescott is working with these property owners to come to a resolution.


The public boat launch has been reconstructed and seems to be working fine and is more useable to the public. We are stepping up our patrol at the boat launch to catch violators that don't pay their launch fees.

The Police Department will be increasing its patrolling of the downtown area on the weekends when traffic is the heaviest. We will be concentrating on speed related issues and loud vehicles.

The process for an eligibility list for a vacancy that has come about due to an officer resigning to take a position with the Pierce County Sheriff's Office, has begun. The deadline for applications was May 27, 2016. We will be proceeding with that process.

The Khueni homicide case is still progressing and will come to trial in August.
